The Skiing

TLH prides itself on providing some of the world's most exciting skiing and snowboarding set amongst the magnificent and heavily glaciated Chilcotin Mountains. The quality and variety of our terrain has fast become famous around the globe.

The Glaciers & Open Bowls

Our glaciers and alpine bowls stretch forever. Carve turns through the deep blankets of powder, surrounded by jagged and awe inspiring peaks. Many of our guests return year after year to ski fabulous runs such as Icemaker Mountain, Blind Man's Bluff and Cougar Glacier.

The Trees

For many skiers, tree skiing is the essence of Heli-Skiing. The terrain is challenging, the snow is deep and lies protected from the elements amongst the spectacular old growth forests. Runs like Grahams, Tillsworth, Playoff and Cinnabar Ridge are a dream come true. Our guides are always happy to provide pointers on tree skiing techniques in order to make this integral part of Heli-Skiing an enjoyable experience for everyone.

The Perfect Combination

Many runs start on the high alpine glaciers and end well below tree line, deep in the valley bottoms. Runs such as Gun Josie, Quiksilver, The Swiss Peaks and Moon Doggie are gems, combining the best of both high alpine glacier and tree skiing. These runs truly provide the most exhilarating Heli-Skiing available in the world.

Vertical Footage

The average footage skied per week is approximately 130,000 vertical feet (39,600 vertical meters). Well over 200,000 vertical feet (61,000 vertical meters) have been skied in a week, while on occasions, only 70,000 vertical feet (21,300 vertical meters) have been managed. The amount of skiing is determined by several factors; the skiing ability of our guests, the amount they desire to ski, the weather and snow conditions, as well as the available daylight hours.

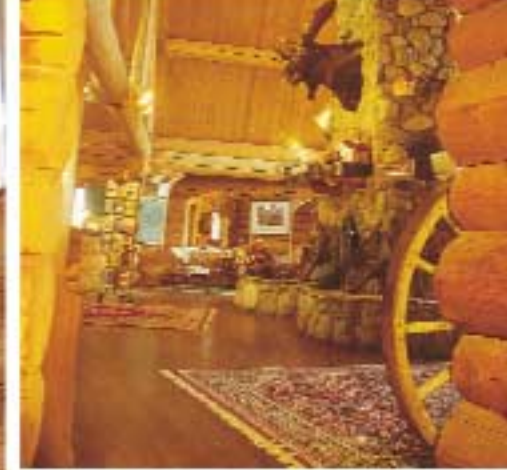
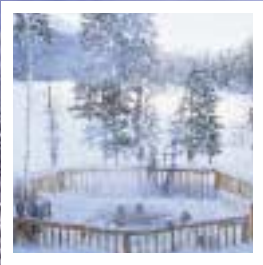

TLH Country

Tyax Mountain Lake Resort, the base for TLH Heli-skiing, is located on the shores of Tyaughton Lake. Our heli-pads are right at the lodge and in minutes you are whisked away into our extensive ski area within the Southern Chilcotin Mountains of British Columbia.

Our Ski Area

To the west lies a vast expanse of glaciers, remnants from the Ice Age which still cover hundreds of square kilometers. To the east lies the rolling, dry Fraser Plateau. TLH Heli-skiing operates in the transition zone which provides the best of all worlds - magnificent mountains, an abundance of dry powder snow and plenty of sunshine.

To date we have in excess of 300 runs in an area of 830,000 acres. That's 3,500 km² (1,300 miles²) or roughly 200 times the size of the ski area of Vail, Colorado.

Snowfall

Our average annual snowfall at 5,900 feet (1,800 meters) is approximately 45 to 60 feet (14 to 18 meters) which leaves us with an average base of 10 to 12 feet (3 to 4 meters) of snow on the ground. It's not unusual to find 16 feet (5 meters) or more of snow at higher elevations on the glaciers.

Temperatures

Temperatures are generally well suited for skiing and range from -5°C to -15°C (23°F to 5°F). However, it is possible that there can be a short spell of rain or that the thermometer can drop to -40°C (-40°F).

Snow Conditions

Records show that during 75% of our season the snow conditions are good to outstanding. Although, you must be aware that Heli-Skiing is not always perfect and conditions may occasionally be very challenging.

Our guides are always striving to seek out the best possible snow and runs for our guests. With such an enormous ski area at our disposal, the choices are so numerous that good conditions can usually be found.

On average, it is only about one half a day per week that bad weather makes it impossible to ski at TLH Heli-skiing.

TLH Packages

TLH Heli-skiing offers a variety of packages to cover a wide range of skier types and desires. Our packages are all-inclusive with the exception of bar and dinner beverages and massage therapy.

Deluxe Packages

At TLH Heli-skiing all of our packages are in fact Semi-Private Deluxe Packages as we always ski with a maximum of two groups per helicopter.

This exclusive service lets everyone experience more untracked powder runs in a vaster area every day. Both groups of each helicopter depart from and return to the lodge daily by helicopter. Therefore, there are no bus rides and no extended waiting times to start and end a memorable day of skiing. We offer 7, 5, 4, 3, and 2 day packages. These packages are designed for the advanced intermediate to expert skier. A good level of fitness is strongly recommended, as physical preparation will greatly enhance your Heli-Skiing vacation.

Private Packages

Custom-tailored to meet your every need, the private package at TLH Heli-skiing caters to groups both big and small. You have the freedom and versatility to ski at your own pace with your personal helicopter and guide anywhere in our area where suitable conditions prevail. Our private packages are for groups of 2 to 10 guests. For more information, please ask for details on our Gold and Platinum private tours.

Heli-Skiing Program

Whether you arrive by motor coach or by helicopter, the journey is absolutely breathtaking. You will experience some of the most rugged vistas British Columbia offers.

Check-In Day

Upon your arrival at Tyax Mountain Lake Resort you attend an informal welcome session, where you meet the TLH crew who run through the daily schedule with you. **At this time, we explain and have you sign the waiver form. All of our guests must sign this waiver prior to skiing with us. A copy of this waiver can be found on the inside back-cover of this brochure.**

Although we endeavor to keep groups together, it is entirely at the discretion of our guides in which group you ski. This is in the interest of making the experience of all of our guests as enjoyable as possible.

Skiing Days

At 7:00 a.m. on your first skiing day, your guide instructs you on the use and care of the electronic Avalanche Transceiver. Everyone has an opportunity to practice several searches. Following which, you meet your pilot at the helicopter and go through

a helicopter safety briefing. The first groups of each helicopter depart the lodge daily at 8:45 a.m.

Breakfast

Breakfast is served daily at 7:30 a.m. One of our guides informs you of the days weather forecast, snow conditions and specific departure times for each group.

Lunch

Lunch is a relaxed outdoor picnic-style affair in the mountains. Enjoy a hearty lunch of home-made soup, sandwiches, dessert, accompanied by hot and cold drinks.

Dinner

Join your guides at 7:00 p.m. in the dining room for dinner. The groups daily vertical is also posted at this time.

Check-Out Day

We ask you to have your bags packed and to be checked out of your room in the morning before you depart for your last day in the powder. Upon your return from skiing there's plenty of time to shower and change into your travelling clothes.

Safety

TLH Heli-skiing's priority is to ensure your safety and to provide you with an outstanding skiing vacation.

Our Guides

Our guides are chosen not only for their guiding skills and qualifications, but also their enthusiastic and outgoing nature. They are professional guides who have passed a series of comprehensive examinations to qualify them as members of the A.C.M.G. and the U.I.A.G.M., the recognized Canadian and International Mountain Guide Associations. They are continually balancing exciting and challenging skiing with the safety and enjoyment of the entire group.

Snow and Avalanches

Our guides continuously monitor the weather conditions and evaluate the snow stability in an effort to minimize hazards. They choose suitable skiing areas based on these evaluations and the groups skiing ability. In addition, together with other leading Heli-Skiing companies in British Columbia, we sponsor an ongoing avalanche research project with the University of Calgary.

In spite of our best efforts, there are inherent risks and hazards associated with Heli-Skiing that are beyond our control and that you must share with us.

Helicopters and Pilots

Our guests enjoy the comfort and reliability of 11 passenger, jet-powered Bell 212 helicopters. For smaller private groups we use jet-powered A-Star helicopters. Our pilots are chosen with similar qualities in mind as are our guides, and have a wealth of experience flying in the mountains. Helicopter maintenance is provided by our on-site team of engineers.

Emergencies

Continuous radio contact between the pilots, guides and the lodge ensure a fast response in the event of an emergency. The guides carry

emergency equipment in their packs, additional equipment is carried in the helicopters and there are several rescue caches within our ski area. If needed, two hospitals and additional helicopter bases are within 30 minutes flying time.

Insurance

If an evacuation by helicopter is needed in case of an accident, the costs are at your expense. Please ensure that your regular medical insurance covers transportation by helicopter or ambulance from our lodge to the nearest hospital. Equipment For Heli-Skiing

Proper equipment is essential and an important factor in your overall Heli-Skiing experience.

Skis and Poles

Our Guides, as well as the majority of our guests, have come to prefer the versatility of our mid-width skis that combine the flotation of a fat ski and the carving ability of a giant slalom ski. Our ski technicians assist you in choosing the ski most suited to you. These specially designed

powder skis make Heli-Skiing seem effortless to the advanced skier and allow the less experienced powder skier to feel more confident. Skis and poles are included in all packages.

Boots

The best boots for Heli-Skiing are regular ski boots that you have worn before and feel comfortable. Avoid new boots, as pressure points could cause you problems.

We have no stock of ski boots and we recommend that you carry your ski boots on the plane as hand luggage so that they are sure to arrive!

Gloves

Long gauntlet style powder gloves are highly recommended for keeping powder out from under the ski suit or jacket cuffs.

Clothing

On any given day, a wide variety of weather conditions and temperatures may be encountered. Therefore, we recommend that you wear two or three thin layers under your ski suit, which can easily be removed.

TLH Gift Shop

Our famous Heli-Ski Gloves and a selection of ski accessories such as goggles, sunglasses and sunscreen are available. In addition, we carry a fine line of both casual and ski clothing as well as souvenirs.

The base for TLH Heliskiing is at Tyax Mountain Lake Resort, on the shores of beautiful Tyaughton Lake, approximately 125 miles (200 km) north of Vancouver, B.C. Transfers to Tyax Mountain Lake Resort are provided by courtesy bus from Vancouver or Whistler Resort. Helicopter transfers from Vancouver or Whistler can be arranged on request.

Questions & Answers

1. What are the reasons for choosing TLH Heliskiing?

Our guests seek an incomparable powder skiing experience and want to enjoy it with old and new friends in a beautiful remote mountain lodge. All of our regular packages are in fact Semi-Private Deluxe Packages as we ski with only 2 groups per helicopter. This means that our guests don't have to go through the questionable experience of daily bus rides, long waiting times for the helicopter and are able to ski a greater variety of powder runs in a vaster area every day. Our climate zone provides us with lots of dry powder snow and sunny weather. Add more than 300 runs accessible in 10 different mountain ranges and you have THE place for a superb Heli-Skiing or Heli-Boarding vacation.

2. How are the skiing groups chosen?

Groups are made based upon ability, the group travelling together and weight. Although we endeavour to keep groups together, it is entirely at the discretion of our guides in which group you ski. This is in the interest of making the experience of all our guests as enjoyable as possible.

3. Can I bring my snowboard?

Of course! TLH is renowned in the inner circles of snowboarding as THE place to go. Snowboarders already account for nearly 1/3 of our guests. Please note that we have no rental snowboards.

4. Can I be reached at Tyax Mountain Lake Resort?

TLH Heliskiing Registration Policies & Conditions

The following conditions become contractual content.

Organizer

TLH HELISKIING LTD. (hereinafter called TLH) is the organizer of the Heli-Skiing packages described in this brochure. The Travel Agency representing TLH is only a mediator authorized for encashment.

Registration and Payment

The space available for Heli-Skiing in our remote wilderness lodge is limited. To avoid disappointment, we strongly suggest you register early. A deposit has to be made to TLH or your Travel Agency within 10 days of receiving a written reservation confirmation. The payment of the balance is due 90 days prior to the beginning of the Heli-Skiing package. If the payment balance required is not received by TLH or the Travel Agent on time, the reservation will be cancelled without notice to the skier and will be treated as a cancellation by the skier more than 90 days in advance of the beginning of the arrival date. For bookings of packages made less than 90 days prior to their beginning, the full package-price is due immediately.

Cancellation

If a cancellation is necessary for any reason, it should be made in writing. If a confirmed reservation has to be cancelled more than 90 days before the beginning of the package, TLH will retain the deposit. **The deposits for Heli-Skiing are totally non-refundable!** If a cancellation is made less than 90 days before the arrival date, the total package price is due in full. No cancellation fee has to be paid if the skier cancelling his package finds himself a suitable person as his substitute that takes over his contractual obligations, but only if the cancelled space is still available.

Liability

By registering for a TLH Heliskiing package you acknowledge the risks of mountainous areas in winter weather conditions. You are aware of the fact that even a highly qualified mountain-guide is not infallible and that, under these circumstances, he sees himself confronted with extreme situations which are not fully controllable. Therefore, his duty will only consist in limiting the risk to a minimum.

Each participant will be required to sign a RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS, ASSUMPTION OF RISKS AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT before being allowed to ski with us. A sample of this waiver form is reprinted in this brochure.

All claims - irrespective of the nationality of the participants - shall be governed in all respects by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia.

Insurance

Trip cancellation insurance is provided.

Other types of travel insurance we recommend are:

- Medical insurance to cover hospital costs and ambulance expenses
- Helicopter evacuation insurance which covers evacuation from the field to our lodge
- Personal insurance to cover loss of baggage, skis and personal belongings
- Liability insurance

Make sure these insurances cover you while you are in Canada. Your travel agent will be happy to advise you and send you the appropriate documentation. **Helicopter Evacuation insurance may be purchased from TLH upon your arrival at the lodge.**

Various

The price for this Heli-Skiing package can be paid to TLH or your travel agent in Canadian funds or in your currency. When paying with currencies other than Canadian funds, the exchange rate of the day of invoicing will be used.

The participant is responsible for arriving on time at the TLH departure point and for conforming to the Canadian Customs Regulations. Your travel agent and TLH will be pleased to assist you in booking your flights, hotels and pre or post Heli-Skiing arrangements.

To your specific attention

As this ski adventure can only be available to a few skiers due to the exclusive character of our operation, we ask you to thoroughly read our Heli-Skiing brochure and our price list before registering. According to your commitments, costly measures are taken and other interested skiers may be turned away.

DEFINITIONS

In this agreement:

- the term "skiing" shall include "snowboarding" and "telemark skiing";
- the term "wilderness skiing" shall apply to both "helicopter skiing" and "snowcat skiing" and shall include all activities, services and use of facilities either provided by or arranged by the Operator or in any way related to either helicopter skiing or snowcat skiing including, but not limited to: orientation and instruction sessions; transportation; accommodation and recreational activities in addition to skiing; loading, unloading and travel in or movement around helicopters and snowcats; and all skiing and other activities in the alpine area.

ASSUMPTION OF RISKS - AVALANCHES, ALPINE TERRAIN, WILDERNESS TRAVEL, WEATHER, ETC. I am aware that wilderness skiing involves risks, dangers and hazards in addition to those normally associated with downhill skiing. Avalanches occur frequently in the alpine terrain used for wilderness skiing and may be caused by natural forces or by skiers. I acknowledge and accept that the Operator and its staff may fail to predict whether the alpine terrain is safe for skiing or whether an avalanche may occur. The alpine terrain used for wilderness skiing is uncontrolled, unmarked, not inspected and involves many risks, dangers and hazards in addition to that of avalanche. These may include, but are not limited to: ice and snow cornices; trees, tree wells and tree stumps; creeks; rocks; boulders; forest deadfall; holes and depressions on or below the snow surface; cliffs; variable and difficult snow conditions; crevasses; snowcat roads and road banks, fences, and other man-made structures; impact or collision with other skiers; the failure to ski safely or within one's own ability or within designated areas; negligence of other skiers; and **NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF THE OPERATOR OR ITS GUIDES AND EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING THE FAILURE OF THE OPERATOR OR ITS GUIDES AND EMPLOYEES TO SAFEGUARD OR PROTECT ME FROM THE RISKS, DANGERS AND HAZARDS OF WILDERNESS SKIING.** Skiers may become lost or separated from their skiing party or guide. Communication in the alpine terrain is difficult and in the event of an accident, rescue and medical treatment may not be available. Alpine weather conditions may be extreme and can change rapidly and without warning, making travel by helicopter or snowcat hazardous.

I AM AWARE OF THE RISKS, DANGERS AND HAZARDS ASSOCIATED WITH WILDERNESS SKIING AND I FREELY ACCEPT AND FULLY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, DANGERS AND HAZARDS AND THE POSSIBILITY OF PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR LOSS RESULTING THEREFROM.

NOTICE TO SNOWBOARDERS AND TELEMAR SKIERS - INCREASED RISK

Unlike alpine ski boot/binding systems, snowboard and some telemark boot/binding systems are not designed or intended to release and will not release under normal circumstances. Snowboarders and telemark skiers without ski brakes are also required to use a retention device or safety strap. These factors will increase the risk of not surviving an avalanche.

RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

In consideration of The Operator, The Helicopter Company and The Province allowing me to participate in wilderness skiing, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, I hereby agree as follows:

- To waive any and all claims that I have or may in the future have against the operator, the helicopter company and the province and their directors, officers, employees, guides, agents, independent contractors and representatives (all of whom are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Releasees") arising out of any aspect of my participation in wilderness skiing;
- TO RELEASE THE RELEASEES from any and all liability for any loss, damage, expense or injury including death that I may suffer or that my next of kin may suffer as a result of my participation in wilderness skiing, DUE TO ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE, BREACH OF CONTRACT, OR BREACH OF ANY STATUTORY OR OTHER DUTY OF CARE, INCLUDING ANY DUTY OF CARE OWED UNDER THE OCCUPIERS LIABILITY ACT, R.S.B.C. 1979, C. 303, ON THE PART OF THE RELEASEES, AND INCLUDING THE FAILURE ON THE PART OF THE RELEASEES TO SAFEGUARD OR PROTECT ME FROM THE RISKS, DANGERS AND HAZARDS OF WILDERNESS SKIING REFERRED TO ABOVE;
- TO HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY THE RELEASEES from any and all liability for any property damage or personal injury to any third party resulting from my participation in wilderness skiing;
- That this Agreement shall be effective and binding upon my heirs, next of kin, executors, administrators, assigns and representatives, in the event of my death;
- That this Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia; and
- That any litigation involving the parties to this Agreement shall be brought within the Province of British Columbia.

In entering into this Agreement I am not relying on any oral or written representations or statements made by the Releasees with respect to the safety of wilderness skiing, other than what is set forth in this Agreement.

I CONFIRM THAT I HAVE READ AND UNDERSTOOD THIS AGREEMENT PRIOR TO SIGNING IT, AND I AM AWARE THAT BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT I AM WAIVING CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS WHICH I OR MY HEIRS, NEXT OF KIN, EXECUTORS, ADMINISTRATORS, ASSIGNS AND REPRESENTATIVES MAY HAVE AGAINST THE RELEASEES.
